

## Monitoring & Evaluation in Humanitarian Settings

### Course Aim

This training aims to develop the competencies needed to monitor and evaluate interventions in humanitarian contexts, during and post-disaster.

### Who is the course for?

This course is aimed specifically at humanitarian programme officers, managers, coordinators, M&E officers, and others who are involved or participate in monitoring and evaluation humanitarian activities and want to further improve their monitoring and evaluation abilities and their humanitarian M&E system.

### Course Objectives

- [ to define monitoring and evaluation and differentiate between the two
- [ to demonstrate some essential skills to monitor and evaluate humanitarian programme activities
- [ to plan required humanitarian interventions and evaluate programme impact using appropriate tools and methods

### Completing the course

By completing this course, participants will be able to:

- [ have the skills to be able to identify the basic purposes and scope of M&E in humanitarian settings;
- [ Understand the difference between M&E in humanitarian vs development settings
- [ Describe the functions and build an M&E plan;
- [ Identify and differentiate between conceptual frameworks, results frameworks, and logic models;

### Learning Methodology

It will encourage participants to think creatively and will utilise contemporary adult learning methodologies including: interactive lectures, group work, classroom exercises, activities, work sheet, mapping, discussion, presentations, case studies, video show, games and brain-storming.

### Course Duration

The duration of the course is generally 1- 3 days subject to required depth.
